### **WHAT HAPPENED TO YOUR LICENCE?**

The Court ordered that from 15/11/2019

You will be disqualified from obtaining a licence or permit for a period of 20 year/s from 15/11/2019.  
The total length of your DISQUALIFICATION from getting any such licence or permit in Victoria is 20 year/s.

### **What about fines?**

If you were not at Court when your case was heard, you will get a separate notice from the Court telling you how much you have been fined, and when it must be paid. Fines must be paid to the Court, not to VicRoads.

**Read attached notes to offender.** It will tell you:

What you must do.  
How to get your licence back.  
What restrictions have been placed on your driving.

**If not attached, please contact your nearest County Court.**

### **WARNING:**

**It is a serious offence to drive during a period of suspension, cancellation or disqualification. You could be sent to prison or fined, have your motor registration cancelled and you could be disqualified from driving for a longer period of time.**

### **REMEMBER:**

It is **YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to check with the Court if you are unsure of the restrictions that have been now placed on your driving. You will need to have this notice with you when you contact the Court. The Registrar will ask you for the date that your case was heard and the Case Number.

### **WHAT YOU MUST DO NOW**

If any licence or permit was cancelled or suspended, **YOU MUST** take it to any VicRoads Registration and Licensing Office or post it, along with a copy of the attached notice or a covering letter within **28 days** to:-

- **Failure to surrender your licence/permit can result in prosecution and a maximum fine of \$500.00.**
- Drink driving offenders should find out **now** what they must do before they can get their licence back, because some people will need to start a Drink Driver Program at least 12 months before attempting to regain a licence. (See how to get your licence back below).
- Keep a copy of this notice for your own records so that you will know when to apply to get your licence back.

### **WHAT YOU MUST NOT DO**

- If all of your Victorian Licences and Permits were cancelled, disqualified or suspended **YOU MUST NOT DRIVE** any type of motor vehicle or motor cycle in Victoria during this time, even if you hold an interstate licence or permit.
- Your insurance company may not cover you if you drive when your licence or permit has been cancelled, suspended or while you are disqualified from obtaining a licence or permit.
- If you have been disqualified from obtaining a licence or permit in Victoria **YOU MUST NOT** apply for a new licence or permit anywhere in Australia during your period of disqualification.
- If only a category of your licence or permit has been cancelled or suspended **YOU MUST NOT DRIVE** those types of vehicles, eg. if the Court cancelled or suspended your licence to drive a motor car but made no order against your motor cycle category, then you may still drive your motor cycle but **not** your car.

### **HOW TO GET YOUR LICENCE BACK**

- If you have been convicted or found guilty of a DRINK DRIVING charge, you should obtain a copy of "The Next Step" booklet from any Magistrates' Court or any VicRoads office and read it. It sets out the steps you need to take before you may be re-licensed. For further information, contact VicRoads on 13 11 71.
- If your licence was **SUSPENDED** - VicRoads will return your licence to you. You will be able to drive as soon as your period of suspension is finished.
- If your licence was **PROBATIONARY** and it was **SUSPENDED** - The period of probation will be extended by the period of suspension plus six months. VicRoads will send you a new licence application form and you will need to be re-photographed for a new licence.
- If your **LEARNER PERMIT** was **SUSPENDED** - You will need to obtain a further permit for six months before you can apply for a licence.

It is a serious offence for a person to drive a motor vehicle while his or her licence or permit has been cancelled, disqualified or suspended. The maximum penalty for a first offence is a **\$3000 fine** or **imprisonment for four months**. For a second or subsequent offence, the penalty is a **mandatory minimum of one month imprisonment** and a **maximum imprisonment of two years**.

**REMEMBER – IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO FIND OUT WHAT YOU HAVE TO DO TO GET YOUR LICENCE BACK.**
